By actively promoting quality care and guiding employees to use health care more efficiently, the primary care physician can help save both time and money. The primary care physician will provide routine care, such as annual well visits and preventive care, treatment for minor injuries and short-term illnesses. They also coordinate care and make electronic referrals to other network physicians and specialists.

Health plan ID cards.

All health plan ID cards will carry the product name UnitedHealthcare Navigate. **The name and telephone number of the employee's primary care physician will be listed on their health plan ID card.** Members should present their health plan ID card to their provider at every visit so that their provider bills UnitedHealthcare correctly. They also have the option of using our mobile app to view their health plan ID card and to share with providers.

- PCPs will provide care for the majority of health care needs, whether it be for a preventive visit or an illness or injury, as well as provide a referral when specialist care is needed.
- Out-of-network coverage is not available except in the case of emergency care.
- Members must obtain a referral from their designated PCPs before they see any other network physician or specialist.

The Illinois Charter product is only available to customers who are situated in one of the following counties: Cook, DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Lake and Will. Also, Charter members must live and work in the aforementioned 6 counties.
